- Score reports for the Fall 2023 digital PSAT/NMSQT and PSAT 8/9, include information designed to spark students' interest in growing careers.
- Test takers will receive information on in-demand careers in their state, including information on median salary, projected job growth, and educational pathways typically taken to obtain that career.
- These insights aim to inspire within students, ideas about what they
 may like to do in the future, broaden awareness, and encourage deeper
 exploration about career options.


How do Career Insights work?

Personalized insights on BigFuture

- Every career requires a certain level of math, reading, and writing skills and this varies for each career.
- Career Insights provides information on how your math and reading & writing skills (based on your PSAT/SAT score) align with the typical requirements for various careers.
 - Example: if one of the careers you're interested in is an Accountant, you will need strong math skills. Career Insights tells you if the snapshot of your math skills are in line with the requirements of this careers or if it is an area you can continue to build skills in.
- This information is simply a starting point and not definitive career suggestions. Career exploration is a
 continuous process because your interests, values, and skills may change over time.



The Holland Codes are derived from the career development model created by psychologist, John Holland. It is one of the leading career theories.



Interest Areas

Doers

People who like practical, hands-on work, such as designing or building something, repairing equipment, physical activity, or working outdoors.

Career Field Examples

Engineering Mechanics Construction Woodworking

Doers are the same as the **Realistic** interest area in Holland's RIASEC framework

Thinkers

People who like searching for facts and solving problems. They enjoy work that involves studying or researching, such as in a lab.

Thinkers are the same as the Investigative interest area in Holland's RIASEC framework

Creators

People who like expressing themselves through creative, original work. They enjoy making visual art, performing, writing or designing something.

Persuaders

People with enterprising interests who like starting and managing business projects. They enjoy leading or advising people, selling or marketing products, and conducting negotiations.

Organizers

People with conventional interests who enjoy work that involves organizing information, often in an office setting. They like projects that follow set procedures and regulations.
