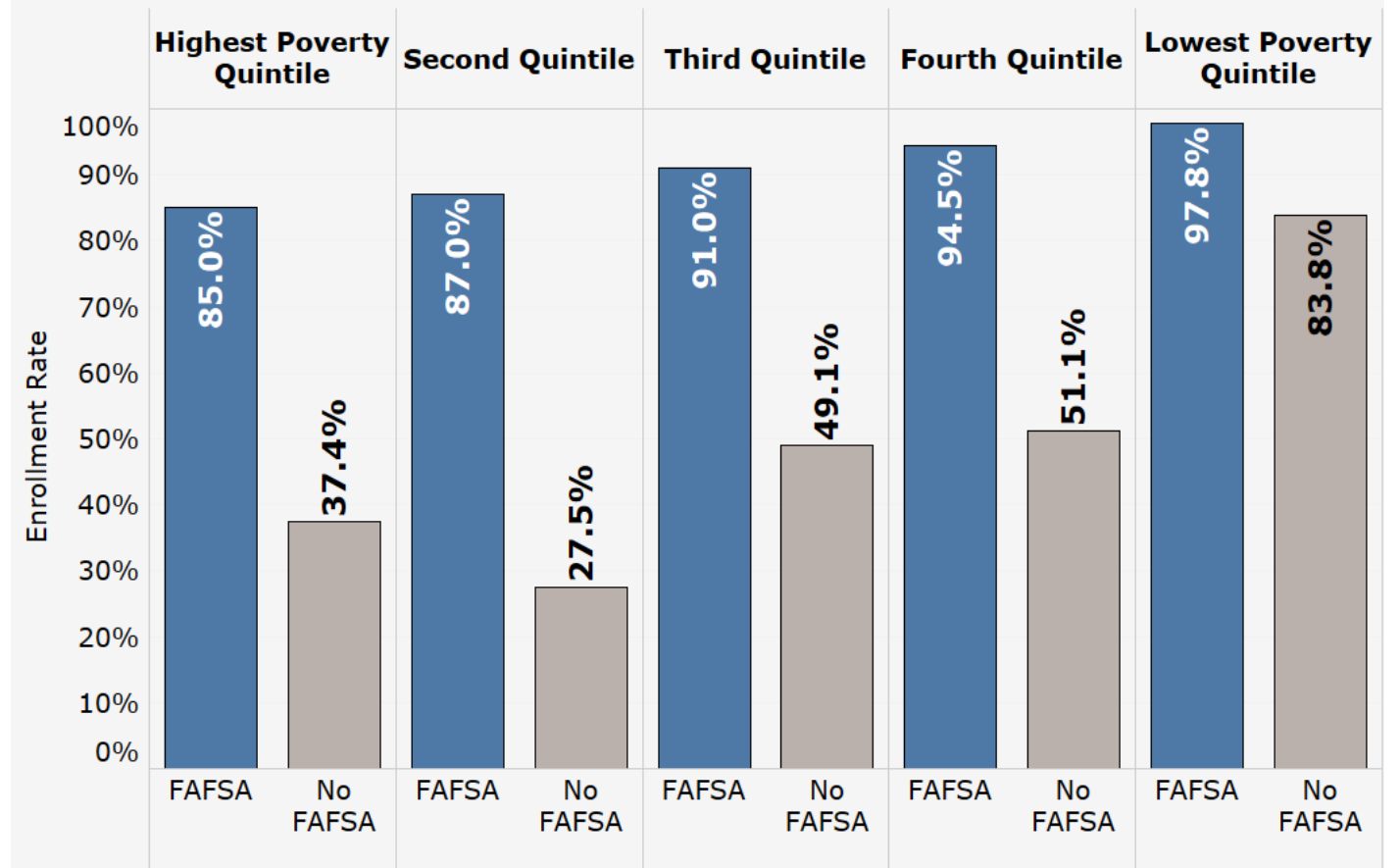

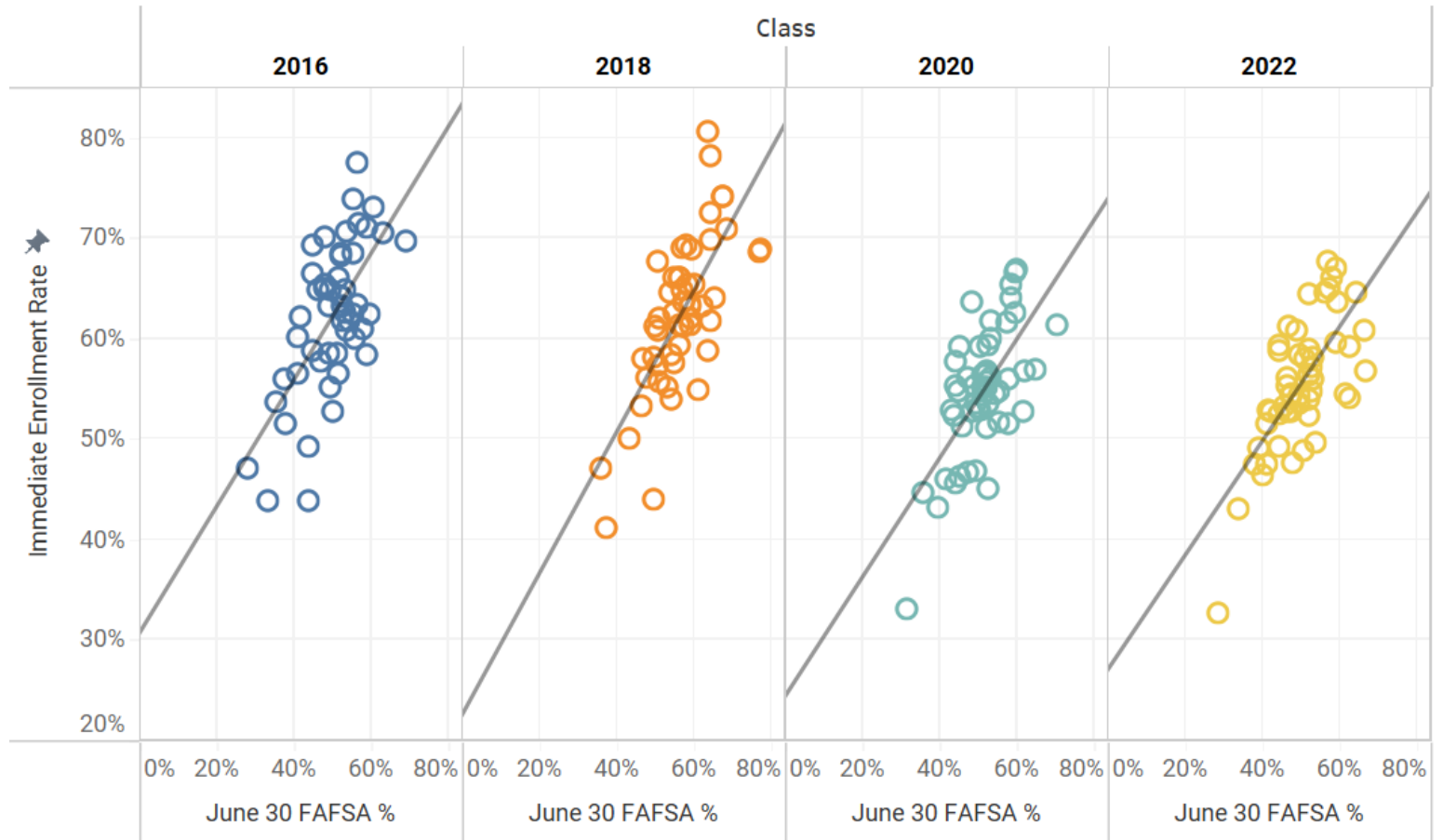
# WHY FAFSA COMPLETION MATTERS SO MUCH

June 30 FAFSA Completion % by Immediate College Enrollment Rate of High School Seniors

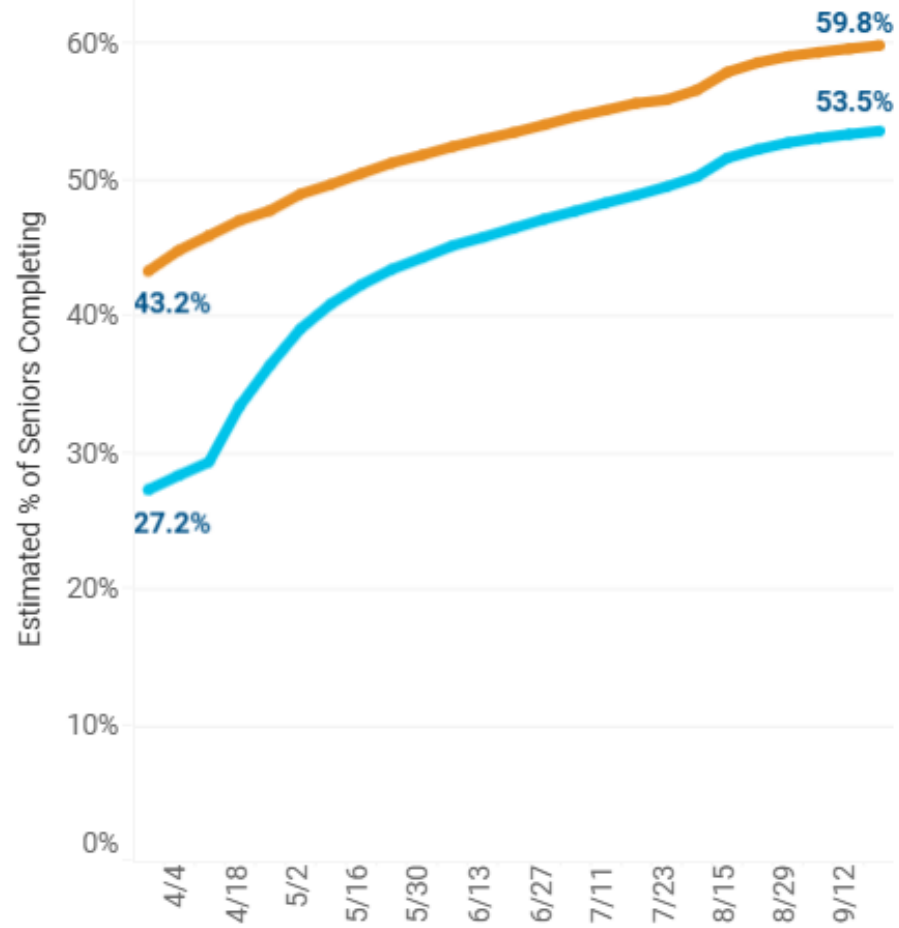


# Five Ways to Turn the FAFSA from “Unfun” to “DONE”

## Get the Data, Use the Data.

- Get student-level FAFSA completion data from the state (where available).
- Working in an “upside-down triangle,” triage the right supports to students and families.
- Using past district and school FAFSA completion data, set completion goals.



## Don't Go It Alone.

- Expand the bench!
- Empower school leaders, teachers, and other professionals to pitch in:
  - Key messages
  - Key dates
  - Encouragement
- Rally around school-wide goals / completion targets, not just at the end of the year but throughout it.

# Look for Partners.

- Partners can promote FAFSA & contribute to completion
- Area nonprofits? Boys & Girls Clubs? 4-H?
- Local higher ed?
- Empowering peer mentors/advisors?

# Why FAFSA Matters

**1**

## **Establishes a Foundation**

For college, career, and military readiness.

**2**

## **Post-Secondary Enrollment**

Those to submit FAFSA are more likely to enroll in college.

**3**

## **Graduation Requirement**

In Texas & other states FAFSA or a state application (TASFA in TX) are a graduation requirement.

**4**

## **Funding**

FAFSA connects students to grants, scholarships, and aid opportunities at two and four year colleges, technical colleges, and trade schools.

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# Graduation Requirement Advantage

- State requirement provides structure for:
  - Educating families about available aid.
  - Addressing common myths.
  - Framing FAFSA as empowerment, not an obligation
- States that require FAFSA for high school graduation:
  - Alabama, California, Connecticut, Illinois, Indiana, Louisiana, Maryland, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Oklahoma, Texas

# When to Start

# Laying the Foundation

## 9th Grade: Explore & Dream

- Introduce college, career, and financial aid awareness early through classroom lessons.
- Connect interests to future college and career pathways.

## 10th Grade: Research

- Explore college options, costs, and scholarship opportunities.
- Attend college fairs and learn how financial aid makes college accessible.

## 11th Grade: Prepare & Preview

- Begin FAFSA awareness: costs of attendance, award letter review, and begin compiling college lists.
- Link test preparation and academic performance to scholarship opportunities.

# Build Awareness Early

## 1 FAFSA Kickoff

Hosting events each fall and spring

## 2 Visibility

Using social media, posters, announcements to amplify communication.

## 3 Success Stories

Highlight last year's achievements: Questbridge Match, full scholarships, and significant awards received.

## 4 Partnering

Partnering with local IHE and our Regional Support. Partner with teachers to normalize FAFSA as part of senior year.

# Start Conversations Early!

## Rising Senior Night

In late spring, we initiate FAFSA awareness activities with our junior class, inviting both parents and students to participate in sessions focused on understanding financial aid and creating FSA IDs.

## Spring/Summer Prep

Individual parent appointments begin immediately afterwards for hands-on support.

## Data Collection

We begin populating our Senior Checklist Tracker during these meetings, several months prior to the start of senior year.

## FAFSA Launch

Early preparation sets the tone for a stress-free fall FAFSA season!

# The Challenge!



- **Common Barriers:**
  - Confusion or misinformation
  - Fear around sharing personal data
  - First-gen family uncertainty
  - Access or language challenges
  - FAFSA Simplification rollout delays
- Counselors overcome these through **early engagement** and **connection**.

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# Create a Supportive Campus Culture

- FAFSA is everyone's responsibility.
- Recognize effort and persistence.
- Keep it visible and celebrated.
- Embed FAFSA into your school's culture

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# Ongoing Team Collaboration

- Meet weekly with campus leadership.
- Focus areas:
  - Senior accountability and graduation progress
  - Difficult-to reach students and families
  - Problem-solving barriers to FAFSA completion
  - Sharing what's working and what needs adjusting
- Weekly meetings keep FAFSA front and center in campus leadership discussions.



# Sub Shortage Days

- Serve as substitutes in senior classes on shortage days.
- Supports campus operations while providing FAFSA one-on-one support opportunities.
- Allows us to:
  - Create FSA IDs
  - Review missing documents
  - Have authentic FAFSA conversations
- A creative, collaborative WIN-WIN for staff and students alike!

# FAFSA Ambassadors

- Empower student leaders as FAFSA Ambassadors.
- Help peers with FSA ID setup and FAQs.
- Promote FAFSA completion among classmates.
- Peer voices create comfort and confidence.



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# FAFSA Focus Days & Financial Literacy

- Use testing days, (PSAT, SAT) for FAFSA Focus Days
- Combine FAFSA completion with financial literacy sessions.
- Partners include:
  - Local credit unions for budgeting simulations
  - Colleges and Universities
  - Local Foundations for scholarship & aid rotations.
- Makes financial aid relevant and engaging
- Meet seniors where they are to complete the FAFSA:
  - Lunch events, senior classes, football games, etc.

GSFAPP AND FAFSA DATA

GSFC provides to eligible high schools GSFAPP and FAFSA Data for the current class of seniors who have completed the GSFAPP and/or the FAFSA for their college freshman year. High schools may use this data to help promote the need for students to submit the GSFAPP (to apply for state aid including the HOPE and Zell Miller Scholarship and Grant programs) and the FAFSA to apply for federal and state aid.

For a student to be on the report, the high school must have submitted the senior's preliminary or final transcript to GSFC, and the SSN matches the GSFAPP or FAFSA record.

GSFAPP Submission Date indicates a student has submitted a completed GSFAPP. The Financial Aid Office of the college the student attends can access the information and will determine state aid eligibility.

FAFSA Submission Date - Student submitted the FAFSA.

FAFSA Process Date - The US Dept of Education's processing center processed the FAFSA.

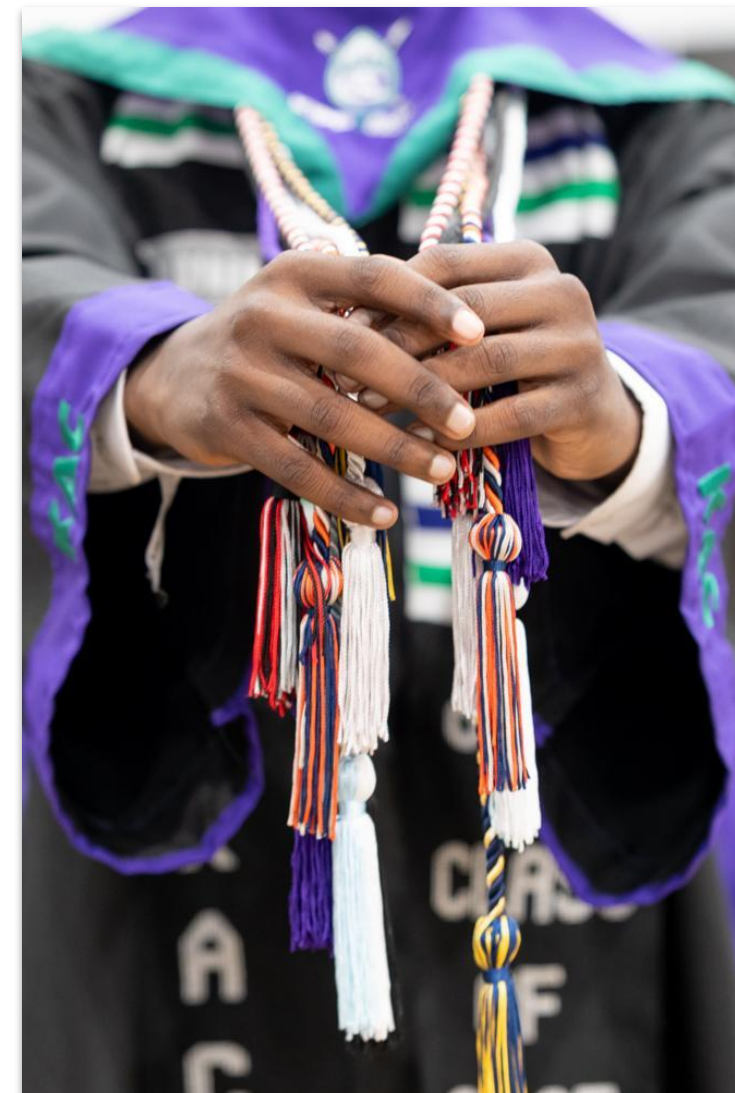

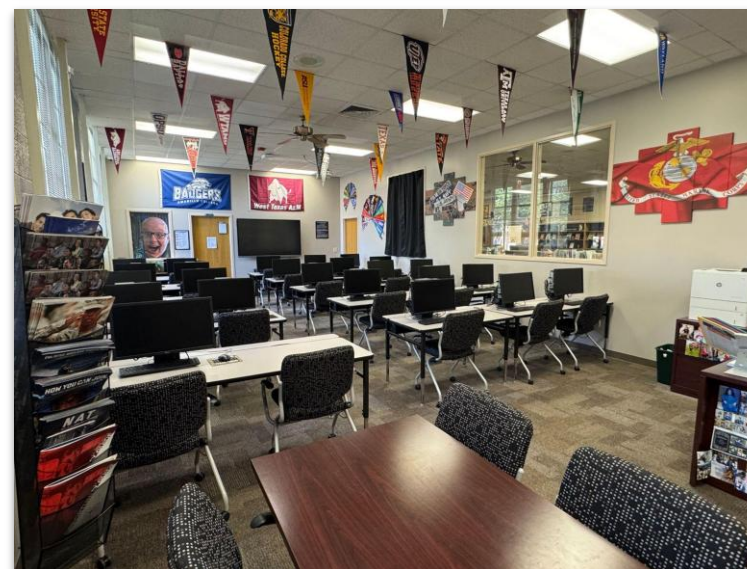

- ✓ **Leverage tools: Safe spaces, classrooms, spreadsheets, and ready made resources.**

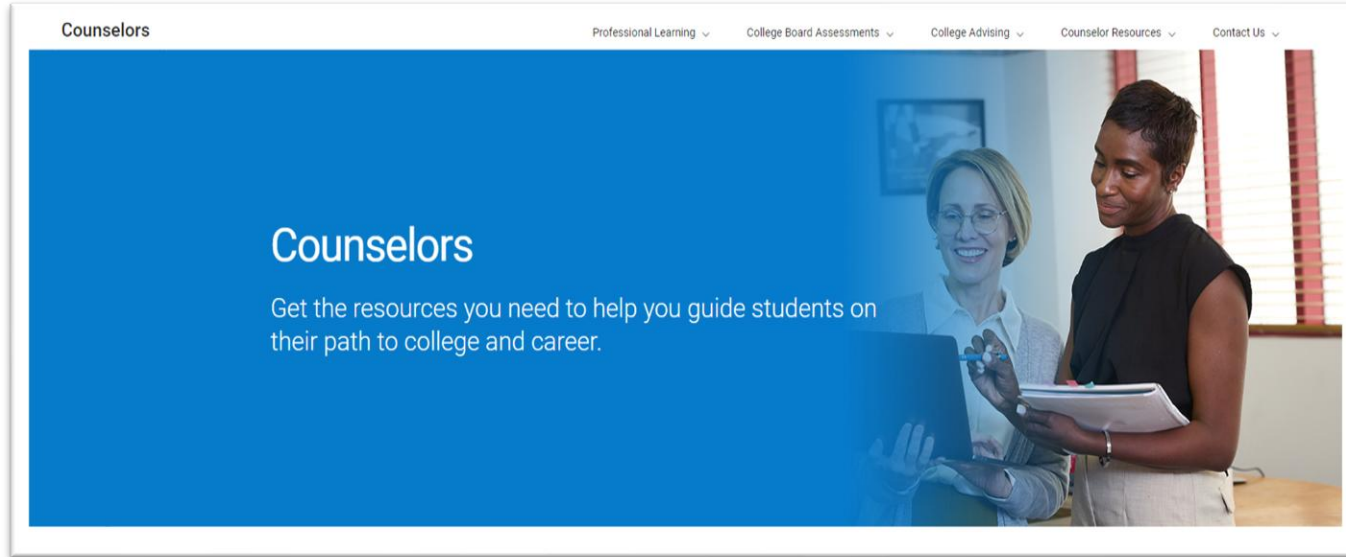
