Advanced Placement Program

The Advanced Placement® Program (AP®) gives high school students the opportunity to study and learn at the college level. It offers 40 courses and exams in a wide variety of subjects. Most colleges and universities in the United States—as well as many institutions in more than 60 other countries—grant credit, placement, or both for AP scores or acknowledge AP scores in the admissions process.

2026 EXAM ORDERING DEADLINES

November 14, 2025, by 11:59 p.m. ET: Deadline for AP coordinators to submit the exam order for all full-year and fall semester AP courses and all exam only sections.

March 13, 2026, by 11:59 p.m. ET: Deadline for AP coordinators to submit the exam order for all AP courses that begin after November 14 and to update fall orders (fees may apply for changes made to fall orders).

2025-26 EXAM FEES

2026 Update: AP Seminar and AP Research Exam Fees Beginning in the 2025-26 school year, the exam fees for AP Capstone™ courses (AP Seminar and AP Research) will be the same as all other AP Exams.

- **\$99:** AP Exams (including AP Seminar and AP Research) taken in the U.S., U.S. territories, Canada, and DoDEA schools.
- \$129: AP Exams (including AP Seminar and AP Research) taken outside the U.S., U.S. territories, and Canada. (Fees may vary for exams at College Board—authorized test centers outside the U.S.)
- Late-order and late-testing fees: \$40 per exam in addition to the base exam fee*

*Applies to each exam ordered between November 15 and March 13; doesn't apply to exams for courses that begin after November 14 or for students who transfer to your school

Unused/canceled exam fee: \$40 per exam**
 **The original exam fee is removed from the invoice. AP coordinators submit known exam cancellations in AP Registration and Ordering by March 13, 2026, 11:59 p.m. ET, or indicate as unused any exams that are ordered but not taken in AP Registration and Ordering before your school's invoice is generated.

2026 FEE REDUCTIONS

College Board provides a \$37 fee reduction per exam for eligible students. Schools are expected to forgo their \$9 rebate for these students, resulting in a cost of \$53 per exam (for international: \$83 per exam. Many states use federal and state funding to further reduce the exam fee for these students.

The SAT is a globally recognized college admission test, widely accepted at U.S. colleges and universities. It's one of the most accessible, affordable, and fair ways for students from all backgrounds to show what they know and stand out to colleges. SAT School Day gives students the opportunity to test at their own school on a weekday while supporting equity and access. PSAT/NMSQT AND PSAT 10

Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test

The PSAT/NMSQT is the qualifying test 11th grade students take in the fall to enter the National Merit® Scholarship Program and to compete for recognition and college scholarships awarded in 2027. Learn more at satsuite.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt.

The PSAT 10 allows students and teachers to pinpoint areas for focused practice as students progress through high school. Taken in the spring of the 10th grade, this administration covers the same content areas as the PSAT/NMSQT and serves as a check-in on progress for 10th graders.

PSAT 8/9

The PSAT 8/9, offered in the fall and spring, sets a readiness baseline for students in the 8th and 9th grade and helps monitor growth over time as students move through the SAT Suite.

A free, online tool that helps schools identify students who are likely to score a 3 or higher on an AP® Exam based on their performance in the SAT Suite. BIGFUTURE SCHOOL MOBILE APP AND CONNECTIONS

BigFuture School is a free mobile app that's available to test takers 13 and older. Students who choose to access BigFuture School can:

- Access their in-school SAT Suite assessment scores and career insights from their mobile phone.
- Explore customized college and career planning guidance.
- Hear from nonprofit colleges, scholarship providers, and government agencies offering education programs through Connections™. Please note that Connections is not available to PSAT 8/9 test takers.



IMPORTANT: Students get access to BigFuture School by providing a mobile number during their in-school exam setup. The number is used to authenticate students' information in the app and alert them when scores are available. It is not used for any other purpose. With Connections (when available), College Board does not share any personal student information with institutions. Students may choose to communicate directly with specific colleges or organizations outside the BigFuture School app.

The College Board National Recognition Program awards academic honors to high-performing students. Students of all backgrounds across the country will be eligible to claim one or more awards: School Recognition Award (New in 2025), First-Generation Recognition Award, and Rural and Small Town Recognition Award.

The CSS Profile® is an online application used in addition to FAFSA by colleges and scholarship programs to award non-federal institutional aid. Students have the opportunity to share their unique financial and family situations through a single online application that can be submitted securely to multiple colleges or programs. CSS Profile accepts applications each year beginning October 1. Institutional deadlines for the application will vary and are available on individual institutional websites.

Fee Waivers

Undergraduate students living in the U.S. may submit CSS Profile for free if:

- Family adjusted gross income is up to \$100,000
- · The student qualified for an SAT fee waiver
- The student is an orphan or ward of the court under the age of 24

CLEP

CLEP® exams provide students the opportunity to earn college credit by passing exams in 34 introductory college-level exam subjects. CLEP has no class requirements and testing is available year-round. Currently, 3,000+ colleges and universities grant credit for CLEP.
