## Using PSAT/NMSQT Scores

## What students will see

When your students get their PSAT/NMSQT® scores, the first thing they'll see in the student portal is their total score—a combination of their scores on the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing section and Math section. 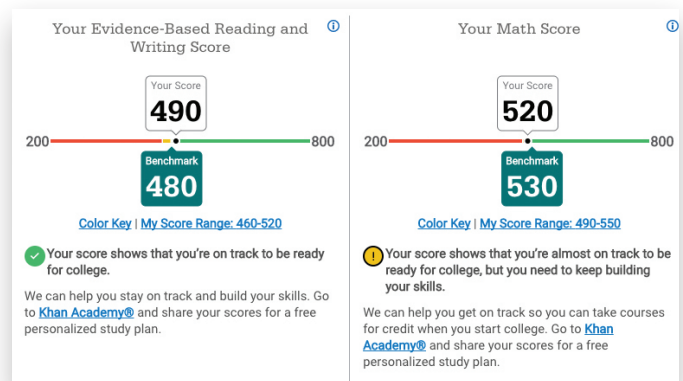

## Benchmarks in the student portal

- Help students see where their current scores fall in relation to the grade-level benchmark

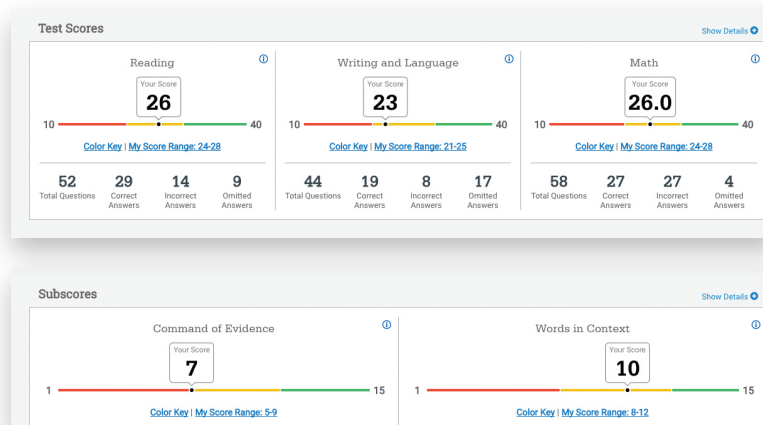


## Test scores and subscores

Test scores and subscores provide a detailed view of student performance on assessments in the SAT Suite.

Score reports use color-coded score ranges to pinpoint skill-level strengths and weaknesses, so educators can take action, helping students meet the College and Career Readiness Benchmarks.

Saturday PSAT/NMSQT administration is non-disclosed; only the percent of correct/incorrect answers is provided. Question content won't be provided.



## What students can do after they get their PSAT/NMSQT scores

### Link Their Scores with Khan Academy for Official SAT Practice

When students connect their College Board and Khan Academy® accounts, they'll get free, personalized practice plans based on their PSAT/NMSQT scores.

- 1 Visit [satpractice.org](https://satpractice.org)**  
Create an account on Khan Academy or sign in to an existing account.
- 2 Link their accounts**  
When prompted, agree to link their Khan Academy and College Board accounts.
- 3 Send their test results**  
Log in to their College Board account, and hit **Send** to get a personalized practice plan.

### Download the Daily Practice App

The free daily practice app will give them even more practice opportunities.

### Explore Careers

When students log in to see their scores, they can connect with **Roadmap to Careers**, found under the **Popular Tools** tab. After answering questions about what they like to do, students will find out which careers match their interests, what degrees they'll need, and what high school courses they should be taking. They can also watch video interviews with real people in related professions.

### Find Out About Their AP Potential

Taking challenging classes is another great way to help students prepare for college. The AP® Potential section of a student's score report shows which AP classes they're likely to succeed in. You can use this information to speak to your students about the benefits of AP.
